Important Change

As Catholics, we recognize the Eucharist as the source and summit of our Christian lives, and the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist is a central part of living our faith. Bishop Taylor announced on Friday, September 25, that the temporary dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation will be lifted as of October 1. This means that starting in October, attending Sunday Mass should again be the norm for most of us. The dispensation will continue for anyone who is especially vulnerable or caring for someone especially vulnerable. The Protocols of maintaining 6 feet separation between non-household members and the wearing of face masks is critical to reducing the infection rate of this disease and remain in effect.
